NAUTICAL FACT OF THE DAY SAILOR'S TATTOOS

There are many traditional tattoos associated with life at sea. 'Hold fast' across the knuckles of young deckhands was supposed to prevent losing grip on vital ropes. A pig on one foot and a chicken on the other were supposed to ward off drowning. These animals were often carried in wooden pens on deck, which would float should the ship be wrecked, and float ashore on currents making them the only survivors. A variation on this later became "Pig on the knee, safety at sea. A cock on the right, never lose a fight". Bird tattoos were often given for completion of voyages. Sparrows or swallows were used to signify 5,000 miles sailed. Compass roses or nautical stars were worn to ensure the sailor always knew the way home, and neptune or turtles were used to show the wearer had crossed the equator or date line. Dragons were worn by sailors who had arrived into a Chinese port, or a ship in full sail to those who had rounded Cape Horn.
